
Sparky's Puppets - "Rhythms & Rhymes"

Harry Potter Film Festival

Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban (PG) 2 hr 22 min



In Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban, Harry, Ron and Hermione, now teenagers, return for their third year at Hogwarts, where they are forced to face escaped prisoner, Sirius Black, who poses a great threat to Harry. Harry and his friends spend their third year learning how to handle a half-horse half-eagle Hippogriff, repel shape-shifting Boggarts

and master the art of Divination. They also visit the wizarding village of Hogsmeade and the Shrieking Shack, which is considered the most haunted building in Britain. In addition to these new experiences, Harry must overcome the threats of the soul-sucking Dementors, outsmart a dangerous werewolf and finally deal with the truth about Sirius Black and his relationship to Harry and his parents. With his best friends, Harry masters advanced magic, crosses the barriers of time and changes the course of more than one life.

Friday, July 13th 2:00 PM Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire (PG-13) 2 hr 37 min

Harry's fourth summer and the following year at Hogwarts are marked by the Quidditch World Cup and the Triwizard Tournament, in which student representatives from three different wizarding schools compete in a series of increasingly challenging contests. However, Voldemort's Death Eaters



are gaining strength and even creating the Dark Mark, giving evidence that the Dark Lord is ready to rise again. In the unsuspecting lives of the young wizard and witches at Hogwarts the competitors are selected by the goblet of fire, which this year makes a very surprising announcement: Hogwarts will have two representatives in the tournament, including Harry Potter! Will Harry be able to rise to the challenge for the Tri Wizard Tournament while keeping up with school or will the challenges along with Voldemort's rebirth be too much for the young hero?

Alert! Did you know that there are 1,900 businesses in Needham, and that 1,175 of them have less

than 4 employees? The Needham Free Public Library has just renewed the *ReferenceUSA Database*, and it will now be available from home. You may search this database from home by going to http://library.minlib.net/search. Click on the "*Database*" tab near the top. Then click on "*Needham*" on the next page. Scroll down to the bottom of the screen and click on "*Home Access to ReferenceUSA*". Finally, enter your Needham Library card number to access the database.

You will find there information on over 14 million businesses across the country. By doing a "Custom Search", you may search sales volume, number of employees, products, services, company officers, and do it all by geographic locations.
