



Anyone who despairs of the individuals' power to change lives has to read the story of Greg Mortenson, a homeless mountaineer who, following a 1993 climb of Pakistan's treacherous K2, was inspired by a chance encounter with impoverished mountain villagers and promised to build them a school. Over the next decade he built fifty-five schools especially for girls that offer a balanced education in one of the most isolated and dangerous regions on earth. As it chronicles Mortensons quest, which has brought him into conflict with both enraged Islamists and uncomprehending Americans, Three Cups of Tea combines adventure with a celebration of the humanitarian spirit.

## Children's Technology Workshop: Space Animation

This animation workshop introduces students to stop motion animation production. Animations are created using digital cameras and capture software. Students learn about all aspects of the production process as they work in teams to write, direct and produce their own short film. Two workshops are being offered – each one for up to 20 children. #### Did You Know

...that the Library is adding Playaways, the first selfplaying digital audio book,



to all of our existing audio book collections.

Half the size of a deck of cards, Playaway is the simplest way to listen to a book. There are no tapes or CDs, and the self-contained unit can hold up to eighty hours of listening pleasure. Playaway comes with the audio content already pre-loaded on it. Using clearly marked buttons, Playaway gives listeners the ability to move back and forth within or between chapters and alter the speed of a narrator's voice. It even has an automatic bookmark feature that remembers where you left off. Playaway has a universal headphone jack that works with almost any type of headphone or mobility accessory.

Come to the library to check out this new collection. All you will need for many hours of listening pleasure are earphones and one AAA battery. Playaways are available in the Children's, Adult, and Young Adult Collections.
