
It's January, 1946, and London is emerging from the shadow of

World War II. Author Juliet Ashton is

having a terrible time finding inspiration for her next book when she gets a letter from Dawsey Adams from Guernsey, a British island that had been occupied by the Nazis. He finds her address in a used Charles Lamb volume and wonders if she might be able to help him learn more about the author. As Juliet and Dawsey exchange letters, she learns about the Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society, a unique book club formed on the spur-of-the-moment, as an alibi to protect its members from arrest by the Germans. Captivated, Juliet sets sail for Guernsey, and what she finds there will change her life forever.

NPL Evening Book Group Wednesday, November 18th Angle of Repose by Wallace Stegner

Angle of Repose tells the story of Lyman Ward, a retired professor of history and author of books about the Western frontier, who returns

to his ancestral home of Grass Valley, California, in the Sierra Nevada. Wheelchair-bound with a crippling bone disease and dependent on others for his every need, Ward is, nonetheless, embarking on a search of monumental proportions -- to rediscover his grandmother, now long dead, who made her own journey to Grass Valley nearly a hundred years earlier. Like other great quests in literature, Lyman Ward's investigation leads him deep into the dark shadows of his own life.

Overdrive has Arrived!!!



The Needham Public Library is pleased to announce the addition of a new online database, Overdrive. Overdrive is taking the place of the Recorded Books database. With Over-Drive, you will be able to download audiobooks and ebooks to your home computer and portable devices. You can also browse the website featuring Minuteman's collection of digital resources and check out titles, or place a request for titles currently "checked out."

The service is compatible with both MP3 and WMA formatted devices (including IPods), as well as being downloadable to either your computer (as an Adobe EPUB eBook or Adobe PDF eBook) or to a Sony Reader (Mobipocket eBooks format). Some of the titles also allow you to burn them to CD, for use with a portable device or in the car. Usage of this database is restricted to residents of Minuteman Network Communities, and can only be accessed from your home computer.
