



Jobseekers can create resumes using a six-step "wizard," edit resumes online, allowing you to print or email them to prospective employers. In the Explore Careers Section, you can learn about and target careers, industries, and states. Going to the Find Jobs section, you can search geographically by keyword across the major job boards and company websites. The links to the actual job postings are also found there. In the Improve My Chances section, you will find articles about industries or employment sectors linked to your profile. Also in this section you'll find listings of trade associations in your field, as well as distance learning courses available to you.
