






Zabinski began smuggling Jews into empty cages. Another dozen "guests" hid inside the Zabinskis' villa, emerging after dark for dinner, socializing, and, during rare moments of calm, piano concerts. Jan, active in the Polish resistance, kept ammunition buried in the elephant enclosure and stashed explosives in the animal hospital. Meanwhile, Antonina kept her unusual household afloat, caring for both its human and its animal inhabitants--otters, a badger, hyena pups, lynxes.

Their lives, like the scenic splendor out their high-rise windows, seemed perfect. It was an illusion. Wilsey's engrossing memoir, Oh the Glory of It All, is about surviving a childhood that was all but destroyed by childish adults.


Author Diane Rapaport – The Naked Quaker: Crimes and Controversies for the Courts of Colonial New England Tues., May 12th 7:30 PM
