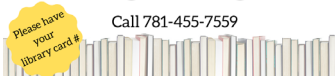

To obtain items:

1. Check the library's catalog to make sure that wanted items are AVAILABLE IN NEEDHAM. No items may be ordered from other libraries. **There is a five item limit.**
2. With your library card in hand, call the library (781-455-7559, x502) between the hours of 9:00 AM. and 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
3. Tell the library staff person your library card number, which item(s) you want, and your telephone number.
4. A staff person will check the library shelves and call you back with pick-up instructions. **Curbside pick-up** will be available on Monday through Friday, from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM at the Rosemary Street parking lot building entrance. Items will be placed in grocery bags that will be labeled and filed alphabetically by borrower's name.

Didgeridoo Down Under Show

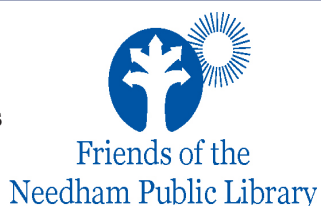
Video Access Week of July 6 to July 12

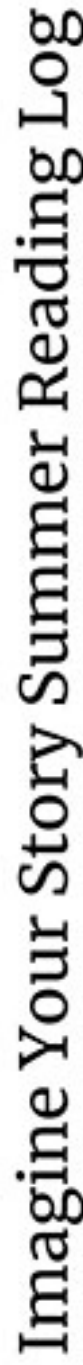
