Through vivid stories of devoted pigs, two-timing magpies, and scheming roosters, The Inner Life of Animals weaves the latest scientific research



In No Visible Bruises, journalist Rachel Louise Snyder gives context for what we don't know we're seeing. She frames this urgent and immersive account of the scale of domestic violence in our country around key stories that explode the common myths–that if things were bad enough, victims would just leave; that a violent person cannot become nonviolent; that shelter is an adequate response; and, most insidiously, that violence inside the home is a private matter, sealed from the public sphere and disconnected from other forms of violence. Through the stories of victims, perpetrators, law enforcement, and reform movements from across the country, Snyder explores the real roots of private violence, its far-reaching consequences for society, and what it will take to truly address it. Meet nine courageous young adults who have lived in the United States with a secret for much of their lives: they are not U.S. citizens. They came from Colombia, Mexico, Ghana, Independent Samoa, and Korea. They came seeking education, fleeing violence, and escaping poverty. All have heartbreaking and hopeful stories about leaving their homelands and starting a new life in America. And all are weary of living in the shadows. We Are Here to Stay is a very different book than it was intended to be when originally slated for a 2017 release, illustrated with Susan Kuklin's gorgeous full-color portraits. Since the last presidential election and the repeal of DACA, it is no longer safe for these young adults

to be identified in photographs or by name. Their photographs have been replaced with empty frames, and their names are represented by first initials. 

2020 McIver Lecture Series—Glassworks! The Art of Stained Glass-Elizabeth Fox, Curatorial Assistant in American Art at the Worcester Art Museum

Previously on exhibit at the WAM were two sets of exquisite memorial windows created by Louis C. Tiffany and John La Farge, which have not been on view for more than 40 years. Originally commissioned for Boston's Mount Vernon Congregational Church in the late 1890's, the large stained-glass works were donated to WAM in 1975 when

the church vacated its building. Elizabeth Fox, who has served as curatorial assistant of American Art at the Worcester Art Museum since January 2019, will speak about this extrodinary exhibit. Currently, her projects involve the reinstallation of WAM's Ameri-

can Galleries which will explore the cost of luxury in early American visual and material culture. This is the first of three lectures, and is sponsored by the Trustees of the Needham Free Public Library in memory of former director Vivian D. McIver.

on. The competition between Boston and New York was played out in an era not unlike our own, one of economic upheaval, job losses, bitter political tensions, and the question of America's place in the world. Books will be available for
