

Chromebooks Now Available for Checkout



The Needham Free Public Library is looking to close the town's technology gap for those patrons who used to come into the library building for their computing needs. Since the coronavi-

rus pandemic began, the library, just as all other Town buildings, per order of the Needham Department of Public Health, has been closed since March 14th to the general public. To help those without computers at home stay safe and get the information they need, the library is now offering Chromebooks for checkout. Thanks to funding from the Library Foundation of Needham, in an effort to meet the needs of the many library users who are working and learning at home, you can now start checking out a Chromebook laptop, by calling the library's reference department at 781-455-7559, ext. 502, starting Monday, December 14th. The five available Chromebook laptops can be checked out for five days. They must be picked up between 12 pm and 2 pm on a Monday and returned to the library on Friday of the same week by no later than 3 pm (Chromebooks can then be requested after another week, as they will be guarantined for seven days in between check-outs). All of the Chromebooks can connect to any Wi-Fi network, including the Library's wireless network, available from our parking lots.




the upper class. But trusted with the secrets of the wealthy, she can never reveal her own...



Newlyweds Celestial and Roy are the embodiment of both the American Dream and the New South. He is a young executive, and she is an artist on the brink of an exciting career. But as they settle into the routine of their life together, they are ripped apart by circumstances neither could have imagined. Roy is arrested and sentenced



to twelve years for a crime Celestial knows he didn't commit. Though fiercely independent, Celestial finds herself bereft and unmoored, taking comfort in Andre, her childhood friend, and best man at their wedding. As Roy's time in prison passes, she is unable to hold on to the love that has been her center. After five years, Roy's conviction is suddenly overturned, and he returns to Atlanta ready to resume their life together.

This stirring love story is a profoundly insightful look into the hearts and minds of three people who are at once bound and separated by forces beyond their control. 
