



English anthropologist Andrew Bankson has been alone in the field for several years, studying the Kiona river tribe in 1930s New Guinea. Haunted by the memory of his brothers' deaths and increasingly frustrated and isolated by his research, Bank-



son is on the verge of suicide. Then he encounters the famous and controversial American anthropologist Nell Stone and her wry and mercurial Australian husband, Fen, who have just fled the bloodthirsty Mumbanyo. In spite of Nell's poor health, Nell and Fen are hungry for a new discovery. When Bankson finds them a new tribe nearby, the artistic, female-dominated Tam, he ignites an intellectual and romantic firestorm between the three of them that burns out of anyone's control.



The Burglary

In late 1970, a mild-mannered Haverford College physics professor privately asked a few people this question: "What do you think of burglarizing an FBI office?" In remarkable detail and with astonishing depth of research, Betty Medsger reveals the

never-before-told full story of the history-changing break-in at the Media, Pennsylvania, FBI offices. Through their exploits, a group of unlikely activists exposed the shocking truth that J. Edgar Hoover was operating a shadow Bureau engaged in illegal surveillance and harassment of the American people.

The Burglary brings the activists, who have kept their secret for forty-three years, into the public eye for the first time—including, new to this edition, the recent discovery of the eighth and final member of the team. The burglars' story of personal sacrifice and civil disobedience is a vital episode in the American whistle-blower tradition that includes the Pentagon Papers, Watergate's Deep Throat, and, most recently, Edward Snowden and the NSA.. *October 21,2015— Cascade by Maryanne O'Hara*

Dr. Gary Hylander—America in the Gilded

The phrase "gilded age" was coined by Mark Twain to describe the years following the Civil War. Reconstruction came to an end and re-



cently emancipated black Americans found themselves living in a Jim Crow South. The frontier disappeared and transcontinental railroads crisscrossed the land. Captains of Industry made great fortunes in oil, steel and coal, while waves of immigrants flooded into America's cities, toiling long hours in sweatshops, steel mills and factories. At the close of the century, differences with Spain resulted in "that splendid little war," a war that propelled the United States to a world power and gave the nation its first celebrity president, Theodore Roosevelt. This is the first of a four lecture series and is sponsored by the Library Foundation of Needham.

Nature Talks: Raising Backyard Chickens Sat., September 12th 7:00 PM




Many have dreamed about owning a small backyard flock and some are just curious about this terrific family pet. Here is your chance to find out everything you need to know about raising chickens. This one hour
