



Author James D. Livingston, PhD. - Rising Force: The Magic of Magnetic Levitation Thurs., June 7th 7:30 PM

From Harry Potter to David Copperfield, there is magic in conquering gravity. The book's uplifting coverage includes flying frogs, levitated sumo wrestlers, magnetic bearings in blood pumps, uranium centrifuges, wind turbines, maglev surgery inside a living pig, and the latest news of high-speed maglev trains. Jim Livingston studied engineering physics



at Cornell University, and received a Ph.D. in Applied Physics from Harvard University in 1956. After retiring from General Electric after a lengthy career as a research physicist, he taught for 20 years in the Department of Materials Science and Engineering at MIT before retiring again. Although a physicist by profession, he has long had a strong interest in American history, and today much of his time is focused on writing (and reading) in history and in science. The Reference Department is pleased to announce the addition of two new databases.



Consumer Reports is long recognized as the standard for ratings of consumer products. This database, now full text, appears on the Needham Public

Library's database page located at:

http://library.minlib.net/search under Databases. After clicking on the link, enter your Needham library card number. It is available both at home and in the library to Needham residents. It was added as a complement to the Boston Consumer Checkbook database which rates services and businesses in the Greater Boston Area.

The Boston Globe Digital Microfilm

Don't have a \$10,000 microfilm machine at home? Now you can have full access to the Boston Globe digitized full-page images from newspapers on microfilm. Convenient controls allow you to browse individual issues, or go to specific pages within specific issues. This database starts with the year 2008 and is a page by page copy of the newspaper. This form of the newspaper runs about a month behind the current issues so it is not a replacement for the current daily Globe.



Upcoming Library Closure for Floor Replacement



Saturday, June 30 - Monday, July 9

The Needham Free Public Library will close for floor renovations beginning Saturday, June 30th, through Monday, July 9th. During this time, the cork flooring on both the first and second floor will be removed and replaced with Marmoleum. As no one will be able to access the building while this occurs, the following procedures are being put into place:

- There will be no Public Access to the Library, including the Book Drops, during this time period. Both the Book and Audiovisual Return Drops will be locked, as no Library Staff Member will be able to come into the building to empty the bins. You may either hold on to your library materials for return when the Library reopens, or you may, if you wish, return them to one of the surrounding Minuteman Library Network libraries. Do NOT LEAVE BOOKS OUTSIDE THE LIBRARY WILL NOT TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR LEFT ITEMS.
- There will be no fines accrued on materials during the closure time period.
- You may either freeze your holds, or designate a different Minuteman library as your pick-up location a few weeks before the library closes, so that you will be able to maintain your placement on the various listings for your holds. Either Circulation or Reference will be glad to assist you in performing this task.
