

This year's theme for the Summer Reading Program is called **Libraries Rock!** It focuses on all aspects of music and the ways in which libraries rock our world. When children sign up for the Libraries Rock Summer Reading Program at the Needham Free Public Library, they will automatically be in a band based on which school they attend. The school that has the highest percentage of their band members read for the most hours over the summer will win the contest and a Rock Star trophy for their school.



Registration for Summer Reading is open now through July 30th. To register, visit the Children's Desk at the library or sign up online at http://www.needhamma.gov/index.aspx?NID=3035. Children who sign

up will receive a free book of their choosing to help them get started reading.

The program is designed for children from birth to those entering 5th Grade in the fall. Adults read aloud to young children. Children who can read on their own may also listen to audio books, have books read aloud to them or read eBooks, as well as print books and magazines. Time spent reading is recorded on a paper reading log at the library or online from anywhere. Children receive a small toy prize when they have completed 4 hours, 8 hours and 12 hours of reading. Each school in Needham will have a music-themed symbol to represent its band at the library with an additional one for preschoolers, homeschoolers and others.

As children read for 2, 6, 12 and 14 hours, they will be able to contribute to the minutes that their band has read.

Every child who logs 16 hours of reading by August 6th will receive another free

book, a toy prize and will be eligible to win grand prizes awarded by random drawing. Those children who read for the most hours will have their names entered in a state-wide drawing to win a Grand Prize from the Boston Bruins. Approximately 27 children across the state will win Bruins prizes such as autographed pucks and jerseys signed by the team.

Email it to ethaler-sroussi@minlib.net along with the name of your band. The library will post all the songs written by each band member on a Summer Playlist on the library website. Patrons will be able to click to hear their song play, along with all the songs written by other summer readers.




This Week's Topic and Books: Latin Drumming!

One Book, One Community Read

After the success of last year's One Book, One Community Read, the Trustees of the Needham Free Public Library, as part of their Diversity Initiative, are pleased to announce this year's title: *Life, Animated: A Story of Sidekicks, Heroes, and Autism* by local author Ron Suskind.

Imagine being trapped inside a Disney movie and having to learn about life mostly from animated characters dancing across a screen of color. "A fantasy? A nightmare?" This is the real-life story of Owen Suskind, the son of the Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Ron Suskind and his wife, Cornelia. An autistic boy who couldn't speak for years, Owen memorized dozens of Disney movies, turned them into a language to express love and loss, kinship and brotherhood. The family was forced to become animated characters, communicating with him in Disney dialogue and song until they all emerge, together, revealing how, in darkness, we all literally need stories to survive.

Autism now affects 1% of the world population, and an astonishing 1 in every 41 births in the US are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder. While America's 3.5 million autistic people are just as diverse as the wider population, many possess a subtle weave of gifts and challenges that, year by year, are revealing underlying—and often unrecognized—capacities of the human mind.

The Library will once again provide copies of the book for you to take (and return for the next person), starting in late May (on the book case opposite the Circulation Desk) and will host a series of Book Discussions in September 2018, along with other programs relating to this year's topic.



Documentary Film: Life, Animated (Rated PG, 93 minutes)

Owen Suskind was a boy of considerable promise, until he developed autism at the age of 3. As Owen withdrew into his silent state, his parents almost lost hope that he find some way to interact with his world in some meaning ful way.

However, that way was found through animated films, especially those of the Walt Disney Company, which provided Owen a way to understand the world through its stories to the point of creating his own. This film covers the life of Owen and how he manages to become as functional as possible with the help of Disney and his family to the point of having his own life. However, Owen soon learns as well that there is more to real life than what Disney can illustrate in animation even as his family prepares itself for an uncertain future with him. Based on this year's One Book, One Community Read, this film is sponsored by the Trustees of the Needham Free Public Library.
