Scott, Amundsen and Shackleton all have a permanent place in the history of exploration of the Antarctic. They were colleagues and rivals. They strove to gain fame not only for themselves, but equally for their country. The



terrain they struggled with was barren, lifeless, and hostile. They met no indigenous peoples there to assist or guide them. All they had were themselves, each pushing themselves to their own human limits. Death was an ever-present consequence. They knew the risks involved, and committed themselves to the challenges. Some would fail, some would be lucky, and some would demonstrate incredible leadership and courage. Join Bob Begin as he examines the leadership style and organizational skills of each explorer and discoverer, and what led each of them to their achievements and failures. ism followed by a demonstration on how to root tip cuttings using a Forsythe pot. This propagation tool is simpler than an expensive greenhouse mist system, more reliable than glasses of water on the windowsill, and can be easily made from stuff stashed in the potting shed. David Rose is an award-winning entrepreneur, author, and instructor at the MIT Media Lab. His research focuses on making the physical environment an interface to digital information. His book, Enchanted Objects, focuses on the future of the internet of things, and how these technologies will impact the ways we live and work.






