And she finally uncovers the story her parents never shared: the gladiolus farm that was once their dream. At once lyrical and raw, unflinching in its detail, Glad Farm is an iconic American story of renewal and reinvention, and the mythic power of a house to define our destiny. 





In this elegant bestseller set during World War II, author Anthony Doerr uses radio's ability to cross enemy lines as a device to weave together the fate of a young, blind French girl and an orphaned German






