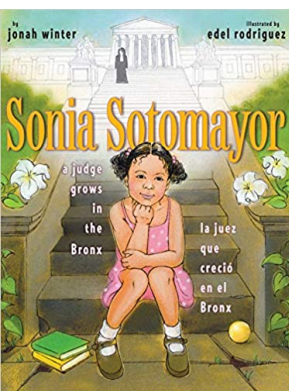

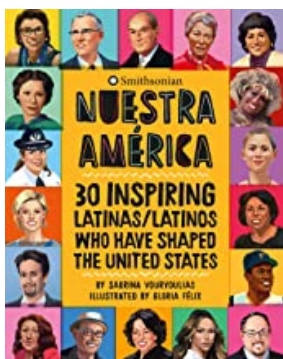
Digging for Words: José Alberto Gutiérrez and the library he built

 In Bogotá, Columbia, José anticipates Saturday, when he can visit the library started by Gutiérrez, a garbage collector.



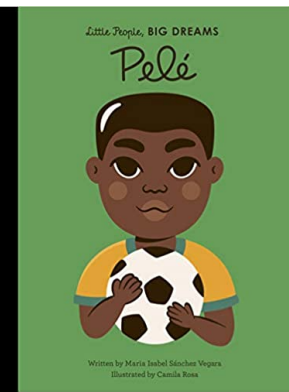
Sonia Sotomayor

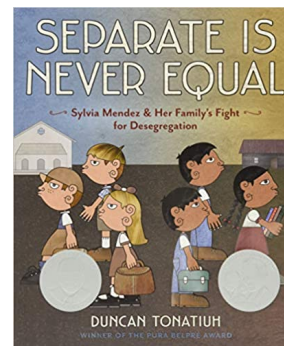

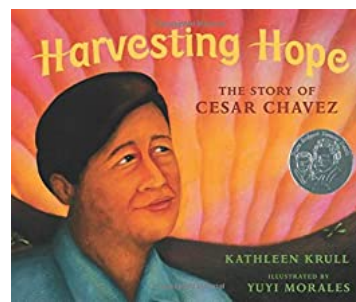
Pele by M.I.S. Veraga

 Examines the unique martial art by describing its origins as a Brazilian slave dance and explaining basic moves and tactics.



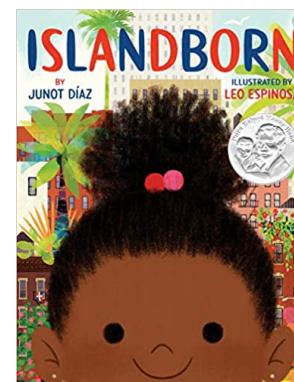

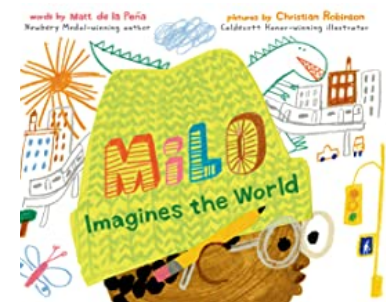

 "Lola was just a baby when her family left the Island, so when she has to draw it for a school assignment, she asks her family, friends, and neighbors about their memories of her homeland."

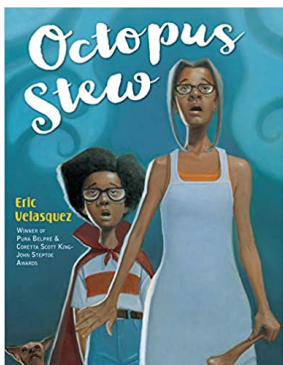
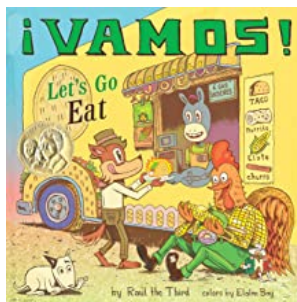
Milo Imagines the World

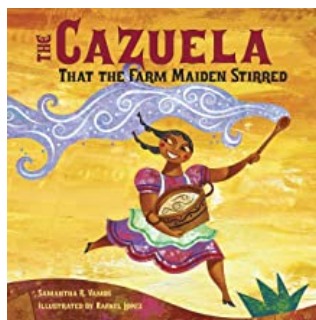
Vamos! Let's Go Eat by Raul the Third

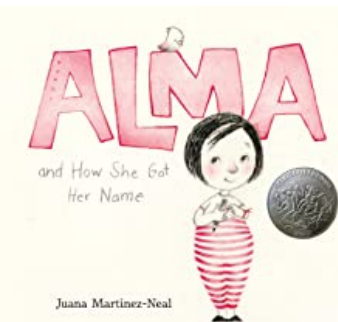
Octopus Stew by Eric Velasquez

A cumulative tale of a farm maiden who, aided by a group of animals, prepares "Arroz con Leche," or rice pudding.



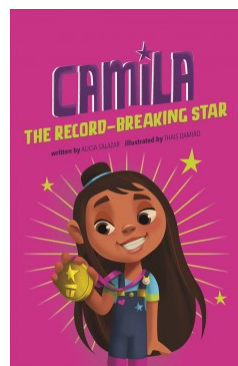
Alma and How She Got Her Name by Juana Martínez-Neal

Camila dreams of being a star and, after learning about children who break world records, decides she will do the same--but how?



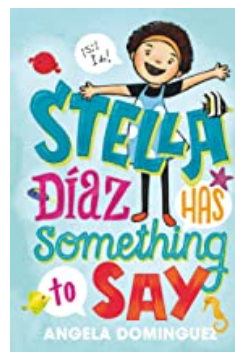
Twins vs Triplets: Back to School Blitz by Jennifer Torres

Stella wants to be friends with the new boy in class, but sometimes she accidentally speaks Spanish instead of English and pronounces words wrong.



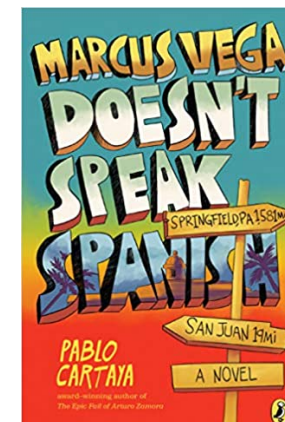
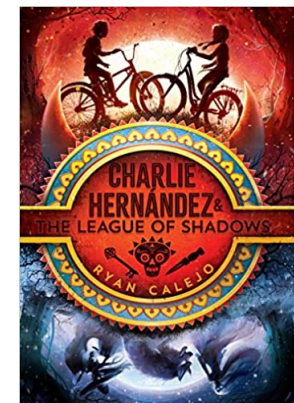
Me, Frida, and the Secret of the Peacock Ring by Angela Cervantes

Shortly after his parents disappearance, he grows horns and feathers and finds himself at the heart of a battle to save the world.

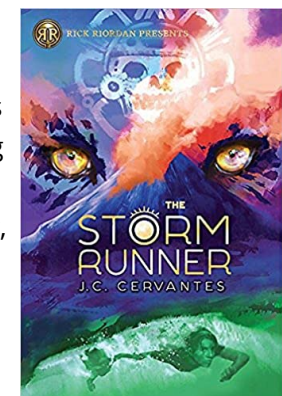


Marcus Vega Doesn't Speak Spanish by Pablo Cartaya
