

The Splendid and the Vile: A Saga of Churchill, Family, and Defiance During the Blitz

by Erik Larson

On Winston Churchill's first day as prime minister, Adolf Hitler invaded Holland and Belgium. Poland and Czechoslovakia had already fallen, and the

Dunkirk evacuation was just two weeks away. For the next twelve months, Hitler would wage a relentless bombing campaign, killing 45,000 Britons. It was up to Churchill to hold his country together and persuade President Franklin Roosevelt that Britain was a worthy ally—and willing to fight to the end.

In The Splendid and the Vile, Erik Larson shows, in cinematic detail, how Churchill taught the British people "the art of being fearless." It is a story of political brinkmanship, but it's also an intimate domestic drama, set against the backdrop of Churchill's prime-ministerial country home, Chequers; his wartime retreat, Ditchley, where he and his entourage go when the moon is brightest and the bombing threat is highest; and of course 10 Downing Street in London. Drawing on diaries, original archival documents, and once-secret intelligence reports some released only recently—Larson provides a new lens on London's darkest year through the day-to-day experience of Churchill and his family: his wife, Clementine; their youngest daughter, Mary, who chafes against her parents' wartime protectiveness; their son, Randolph, and his beautiful, unhappy wife, Pamela; Pamela's illicit lover, a dashing American emissary; and the advisers in Churchill's "Secret Circle," to whom he turns in the hardest moments. Maybe You Should Talk to Someone: A Therapist, Her Therapist, and Our Lives Revealed by Lori Gottlieb

One day, Lori Gottlieb is a therapist who helps patients in her Los Angeles practice. The next, a crisis causes her world to come crashing down. Enter Wendell, the quirky but seasoned therapist in whose office she sud-


denly lands. With his balding head, cardigan, and khakis, he seems to have come straight from Therapist Central Casting. Yet he will turn out to be anything but.

As Gottlieb explores the inner chambers of her patients' lives—a self-absorbed Hollywood producer, a young newlywed diagnosed with a terminal illness, a senior citizen threatening to end her life on her birthday if nothing gets better, and a twenty-something who can't stop hooking up with the wrong guys—she finds that the questions they are struggling with are the very ones she is now bringing to Wendell. Creating A Storm of Horses—with author/illustrator Ruth Sanderson

Children's book author/illustrator Ruth Sanderson, whose exhibit of artwork was in the library for the month of March, will present an illustrated talk about her process of writing and creating the art for A Storm of Horses: the Story of Artist Rosa Bonheur, her new picture book that recently garnered starred reviews from Booklist and School Library Journal.

Ruth Sanderson's career as a professional illustrator spans over 45 years, and over 90 books for children. She is perhaps best known for her original and retold fairy tales, including The Enchanted Wood, Papa Gatto, The Crystal Mountain, Rose Red and Snow White, The Snow Princess, and The Golden Mare, the Firebird, and the Magic Ring, winner of the Texas Bluebonnet Award. All of the original artwork from her book The Twelve Dancing Princesses is in the permanent collection of the Norman Rockwell Museum. The Golden Key, a Victorian fairytale by George MacDonald, features over forty scratchboard illustrations and was previously on exhibit here at the Needham Free Public Library in March of 2017. She has also illustrated many horse-themed books during her career, including A Storm of Horses: The Story of Artist Rosa Bonheur, Hush Little Horsie, (a lullaby by Jane Yolen), cover art from the Black Stallion and Horse Diaries series, and her recent how-todraw book, Drawing Horses.



Libby to Replace OverDrive in 2022



If so, please be aware that OverDrive will be "sunsetting" its OverDrive app in 2022, to be replaced by OverDrive's Libby app (learn more at libbyapp.com). Libby offers the same great content as OverDrive, just with a different look and lots of great features to manage

Are you a user of the OverDrive reading app?

your digital reading! OverDrive will assist libraries with migrating most OverDrive app users to Libby by the end of 2022.

As a first step in this transition, OverDrive will remove the Over-Drive app from the Apple App Store, Google Play, and Microsoft Store this February. After February, OverDrive will provide more information about migrating from OverDrive to Libby.

In the meantime, you can download the Libby app for free from the Apple, Google and Microsoft app stores (search for Libby by OverDrive). You'll find the same great selection of ebooks, audiobooks and magazines, and you can still send select titles to your Kindle.
